Correspondence	Discussion	Action
Bex Malthus, Support for On Track NCEA course	<p>By email a request was made to the committee for a letter of support for Alternative Education at Waimea College (OnTrack) to offer a Waka Ama NCEA unit course. After some brief discussion this was done. Bex and Kereama came to the meeting to talk about the course and answer questions.</p> <p>Thanked us for our support. On Track have been approved as a place that can offer the NCEA units. Run by Schools Aotearoa. Will use material from Te Wananga o Aotearoa. They are sending down their material. Their use of the Maitahi waka will be the same as it has been in the past. All students are members and 16 or under. There are about 8, with a new boy started yesterday. It is only OnTrack students, not any other schools. At the end of the year, there might be some other from Year 12 students.</p> <p>The course is fifteen credits, and includes knowledge of the waka, protocols, safety & paddling techniques. It's one on-the-water session per week, ten to be completed, most of the kids have already done ten paddles this year.</p>	Newsletter

	<p>There is a small unit standard that is around a capsized that could be explored, possibly at the Aquatic Centre.</p> <p>Questions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • how many club Rangatahi? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ About 14-16 of them. There is also a teacher at Nelson College paddling. Some are 16, who will be turning 17 and may then become adult members. • If this is accredited with Min of Education, how does this fit with Waka Ama NZ, and is there any liability for MOCC? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ It started at Te Wananga o Aotearoa, then Waka Ama NZ helped put the standards together. No liability for MOCC. • What is the club getting out of it? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Support of the Rangatahi. None of the kids in the OnTrack programme were already in the Rangatahi programme. It fits in well with our Rangatahi strategic goal. • There's a programme that Te Waka O Aotearoa is trying to put together, what is the relationship between this and that? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ TWA programme has not progressed. • Why was it so rushed? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ It came through in a rush. Bex thinks this is because of COVID19, and the need to get something underway. • For other schools to use the programme, what is required? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Go to NZQA and say that there is a standard. Would need an approved assessor (qualified teacher) and an approved specialist.
